



## Key Instant Recall Facts

### Reception Spring 2

#### Targets

By the end of this half term, your child should be beginning to know:

- How to partition numbers to 5 into two groups.

#### Activities to try at home

Ask your child to show five fingers. 'Hide' some and ask how many are still there? How many are hiding? How many are there altogether?

Count out five objects. Give your child two bowls/plates. How many different ways can they partition them?

Count out five building blocks (lego/duplo etc.) Build two towers using all five blocks. How many blocks are in each tower?

Sing counting songs, using fingers to show the numbers.



#### Questions to ask

How many altogether?

How many in each group?

Can you partition them another way?

Which group has more/fewer?
