
Attendance

Uniform Reminder

As we draw towards the final weeks of the school year, it is easy for uniform standards to slip. Please see the uniform list below, and support school in ensuring your child is wearing the appropriate uniform to school each day. This includes P.E. days where suitable school kit is required please.

Uniform:

- Smart school black shoes - only laces for those who can tie their own
- Grey school trousers, a grey school skirt or grey pinafore
- Burgundy cardigan or jumper
- White polo shirt
- Plain suitable socks or tights (school colours of grey, white, black or burgundy)
- Years 5 and 6: white collared shirt and school clip on tie
- Modesty shorts under skirts and dresses if required and more comfortable

Summer term:

- Ties are optional
- Grey school shorts or skorts
- Summer red gingham dress
- Hats



P.E. kit:

On PE days children will be coming to school in their PE kits for the day. This is generally twice per week.

- White plain t-shirt
- Burgundy hoody or burgundy zip hoody
- Burgundy track suit bottoms
- Burgundy PE shorts (no cycling shorts/tight shorts)
- Trainers (no PE pumps needed).
- Hair tied back on PE days
- No earrings (if these cannot be removed at home or by the child then they will only be able to participate in non-practical elements of the PE lessons)



Other information:

- Earrings - 1 pair of small studs only. No hoops, drop or dangle earrings please. Earrings must be taken out to take part in PE
- Small, plain hairband in school colours only
- Hair neat for school and out of eyes for lessons
- Fitness trackers are able to be brought into school but school are not responsible for the safe keeping. In PE, they must have a sweat band over and are removed for certain lessons
- No make up
- No nail varnish
- Fake tattoos must be removed for school

Please speak to a member of staff if you are struggling to provide suitable uniform for your child; we will be happy to support.

Shires Mat Steps Results


We secured 3rd place in last terms Shires Mat steps against Astwood bank Primary and Feckenham Primary.
