



## Evidencing the Impact of Primary PE and Sports Premium

**Review 2023 - 2024**

**Funding Allocation 2023 - 2024: £16,520**

### Targets

**Key Indicator 1: The engagement of ALL pupils in regular physical activity - Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.**

### Impact

PE lead /SLT carried out an audit and reviewed pupil's unstructured access to physical activity during the school day. Additional resources were purchased to develop provision at break and lunchtimes.

Lunchtimes were extended from 45 minutes to 60 minutes to increase the amount of time pupils were active during the school day.

Outdoor provision and curriculum has been mapped to ensure key skills and opportunities to use outdoor provision are part of the curriculum offer.

Additional staff training was implemented to further embed
