Each section will test knowledge and understanding of the topic through:

Multiple choice questions based on an unseen resource.

Short 2-6 mark questions on a piece of theory, e.g. explain one way in which global atmospheric circulation determines the location of high rainfall (low pressure) areas (3 marks)

An 8 mark question that will involve the use of a case study (from the knowledge organisers)

Multiple choice questions based on a resource

Short 2-6 mark questions on a piece of theory, e.g. for a named UK city, explain **two** reasons why the functions of its inner city have changed in recent years (4 marks)

An 8 mark question that will involve the use of a resource.

Section C1 & C2 will assess knowledge and understanding of fieldwork through:

Short 1-6 mark questions on fieldwork location, risks, methods and data.

An 8 mark question assessing or evaluating an aspect of either hypothetical fieldwork or students own fieldwork.

Paper 3 is a resource-based paper and will include a topic that allows all three sections to be examined, e.g. energy use in Norway. Students are given time (roughly 20 minutes) at the start of the exam to read through the material.

Section A - C will test knowledge and understanding of each topic through:

Multiple choice questions based on a resource

Short 2-6 mark questions.

An 8 mark question that will involve the use of a resource.

Section D will assess the students ability to arrive at a decision based on a range of options given:

There is one 16 mark (12 + 4 SPaG) question that asks students to select an option and justify why they have selected that option and discarded the others.

Use past paper questions to test retention of content

Case Studies


Use knowledge organisers to summarise case studies for each topic and practice 8 mark questions that require the use of case study material.


Q&A Booklets


Question your child using the Q&A booklets. Ideally, start with the topic that they are weakest with and go from there. This should be done regularly.
