CHANGE - this is when things become different than they were before

<u>CONTINUITY</u> - this is the opposite of change, when things stay the same over a period of time

# Key ideas ...




TREND - is when there a number of similar of related changes continuing in the same direction over a period of time. Eg. the fact there were 35 million people with a smart phone in the UK in 2014 is part of a trend.

TURNING POINT - is when a significant change happens, that is different from what has happened before and which will affect the future.

RATE OF CHANGE - change doesn't always happen at the same pace - sometimes thing can change very quickly. Sometime it happens slowly. Historians are often very interested in why.



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
#### **Assessment Objectives**

Ineffective revision: reading exercise book/revision guide


Effective revision: reduce, transform, practice, KNOWLEDGE TESTING
