

Teaching and Learning Guidance for Pupils

September 2020

In the classroom

- You must sit in the same seat every lesson that has been allocated to you by your teacher;
- You must remain in your seat during the lesson;
- You must have your equipment pack each day;
- You must not share any equipment with other pupils;
- Your teachers will collect your book in for marking;
- Your teachers may ask you to upload a picture of your work to google classroom;
- Your teachers will start to use Classcharts again.

Changes to your practical subjects

Science:

- A very limited range of practical activities will be carried out;
- Your teacher will carry out demonstrations;
- Equipment will be thoroughly cleaned between each use by the science technicians
- You will be asked to sanitise your hands before and after all practical work;
- During practicals, you must stay at your desk;
- You must not touch your face during practical work;
- You will have your own set of equipment to use;
- You will be able to carry out your practical safely with limited teacher involvement;

PE:

- There will be no use of sports equipment, no contact sports and where possible your lessons will be outdoors;
- You may follow a different curriculum based on 'Fitness' until restrictions ease.

Creative Arts:

- You must sanitise your hands before and after any practical work and when using shared equipment;
- You must not touch your face during practical work;
- You are not allowed to swap resources during practical work;
- You must wipe down your equipment after practical work;
- You must sanitise your hands after tidying following any practical work.

Drama:

- No props/costumes will be used;
- Years 10-13 will focus on theory aspects of the course for the first half term;
- Smaller classes will carry out socially distanced practical tasks.

Music

- Practical work will be done on a carousel - half the class will be taught by the teacher and the other half will work on the instruments.
- Forward facing exam desks will be used for theory work;
- You are encouraged to bring in your own named equipment, headphones and instruments where possible;
- There will be no group singing;
- Wind instruments will not be used;
- You must sanitise your hands before and after using shared equipment;
- You must not touch your face during practical work;
- You are not allowed to swap equipment during practical work;
- You must wipe down your equipment after practical work;

DT:

- You must sanitise your hands before and after any practical work and when using shared equipment;
- You must not touch your face during practical work;
- Goggles will be used by pupils in your year group only and wiped down between use;
- You are not allowed to swap resources during practical work.
- You must wipe down your equipment after practical work;
- You must sanitise your hands after tidying up following practical work;
- The Technician will wipe down all tools and equipment used with sanitising spray at the end of each day.
- Practical work will be limited in favour of teacher demonstration and where possible only carried out in double lessons;
- There will be no practical work in KS3 until after October Half-Term.

Food:

- You must wash your hands regularly throughout the lesson (using paper towels to dry hands);
- All equipment used will be washed and dried as part of the 'clean down' process at the end of the lesson;
- You must not touch your face during practical work;
- You are not allowed to swap equipment or resources during practical work.
- All practical work is done individually with pupils producing their own dish to take home.
- There will be no practical work in KS3 until after October Half-Term

Remote Learning from September 2020

Plan for Local Lockdown:

- All your work will be set on google classroom;
- You will get the same number of hours work set across the 2 weeks per subject as you would have timetabled lessons;
- Work will either be set by your teacher on a day by day basis or to be done over a weeks worth of lessons (your teacher will detail this in their instructions);
- Your teachers will give you a submission deadline for when the work must be completed by;
- You will not need to print out any resources to complete the online work;
- Teachers will continue to use Classcharts for points and live reporting;
- You will be asked to self-assess some of your work using the answers provided by your teachers;
- Your teachers will also give you individual feedback on some of your work;
- You will not be set homework during this time, but may be set enrichment/research tasks;
- If you are finding the work difficult, please send your teacher a private comment on google classroom or email them using their school email address.

Plan for all absent students:

- If you are off school shielding or poorly then a copy of the lesson you have missed will be uploaded to Google Classroom by your teacher for you to access remotely.
