Dear Parent/Carer

You will be aware that yesterday the Prime Minister announced that all schools will close until February half term. All students will be educated remotely during this period.

Clearly the next few weeks will present challenges for many of us. The intention of this letter is to provide you with information that will support your child.

## Yr11 and 13 students sitting examinations this year

Many students will be understandably anxious after the announcement that examinations will not go ahead as usual this summer. We have not been informed of any alternative arrangements but will communicate these as soon as we receive them. What I can provide you with is the assurance that we will do everything in our power to support your child in achieving success this summer. Students will receive their qualifications and it is as important as ever that students continue to engage in their studies so they are in the best possible position to gain the recognition that their work deserves.

An assembly is scheduled for all students tomorrow at 8.45am. Our Yr11 and Yr13 assemblies will address specific issues relating to examinations. Pupils will be able to access the link for this via an email from their Pastoral Leader.

## Vulnerable students and the children of key workers

The school continues to be open to students who have been identified as vulnerable and the children of key workers. Children attending school should bring a packed lunch. To support our planning we will require you to fill out the form each week via the weekly parental bulletin.

#### **Children eligible for Free School Meals**

Food hampers are being prepared on Wednesday and Thursday this week, with the aim to deliver the hampers to every child who has an entitlement to free school meals provision over the next two days. We are currently awaiting further guidance from the Government for future provision and we will update you as soon as practically possible on this.
