General Principles

- The Sixth Form will provide a wide range of academic and vocational courses at Level 3, which will be available in a variety of combinations to provide a considerable choice of programme for students.
- Students will receive bespoke careers guidance on selecting a programme of study which
 gives the best chance of success to appropriate progression routes after sixth form.
 Decisions should be informed by reference to GCSE grades and post-18 destinations.
- Students who have not achieved 4+ grades in the core subjects of GCSE English and Maths will be enrolled on a GCSE resit course, in order to support their further progression. Students resitting usually will only be able to opt for 3 A-level or BTEC courses.
- All students will follow a general programme including; PSHCE and careers education information and guidance. Work placements can be arranged on an individual basis for students. These must take place outside of term time unless they are an integral part of a course programme or their chosen enrichment option.

Guidance for Students

It is very important that students receive guidance onto courses that will give them the best chances to succeed and access appropriate progression routes. Over 30 Level 3 qualifications are offered each year across a wide number of subject areas. This list is revised annually and published in the Sixth Form Prospectus each January (for entrance the following September). These include traditional A Levels as well as BTEC courses and other Level 3 qualifications. The curriculum is designed to offer progression onto level 3 courses from subjects studied in Key Stage Four. All level 3 courses are challenging but should be accessible to all students if they select within the following framework.

• Students who attain an average GCSE score of 5.6 or more should usually choose four A-Level or equivalent courses to begin with.

- Students attaining between 5 and 5.6 average GCSE score should usually choose three A-Level or equivalent courses.
- Students attaining four grade 4+s at GCSE but with an average grade score of less than 5 should usually choose three A-Level or a mix of A-level and BTEC courses plus resits. Students in this position are likely to be most successful when carrying on successful BTEC subjects from Year 11.

All students will be offered an individual meeting with a senior member of staff to discuss their choices. Students are normally required to study:

- 3 or 4 main subject choices;
- An additional study option (this includes GCSE resits where appropriate);
- An enrichment opportunity;

The sixth form considers each student's individual circumstances. This may, exceptionally, result in the judgement that particular students with fewer than 5 Grade 4+ passes have the capability to succeed at Level 3. Such students would therefore be allowed to study appropriate courses.

Students have a four-week window at the start of Year 12 to experience courses and make changes (subject to timetable and class sizes). After this time changes are not advised due to the amount of the course which has already been covered.

Subject Entry Requirements

Subject specific entry requirements are published annually in the school's sixth form course guide and are the same for internal and external applicants. On enrolment day students will discuss their choices based on GCSE results.

External Students

The Sixth Form welcomes students from other providers. We offer a meeting with the Head of Sixth Form to discuss courses and routes to ensure you are best advised. Please contact the school to arrange this.

Sixth Form Admissions Policy

Whickham School & Sports College uses the Local Authority (LA) admissions policy for entry to the Sixth Form. A copy of this policy is available from the Gateshead Council website.

Induction arrangements

- A general introduction to Sixth Form courses is given in November to both students and parents (interested students from other schools are also invited by letter or advertisement in local press). An informal parent/student conference is held where all Faculties/courses have stands where students can talk to other students and staff about the available courses;
- Following this all students are given an individual support and guidance meeting with their parents with a senior member of staff in which they are asked to make provisional choice of Level 3 courses and, where relevant, are supported with progression to other destinations:

- At the end of the GCSE examinations a Year 12 Induction programme is held where students learn about the extra-curricular events and also the rules and regulations of the Sixth Form. Students also get the option to trial their subject choices to help them decide on their final choices;
- Enrolment generally takes place on the same day as GCSE results day;
- When students start Sixth Form, we usually organise two days of induction. These
 induction days help to familiarise students with life in the Sixth Form and how this is
 different to Year 11.Students are also supported with induction activities relating to study
 skills:
- Additional induction sessions are organised for external students covering areas such as site orientation and ICT facilities;
