PARAMEDIC



Paramedics are often the first medically training people to arrive at a medical emergency. They determine a patient's state, provide essential care and transport patients to hospital or other healthcare facilities. In up to 50% of cases, patients are treated at home—however paramedics could be asked to treat a patient anywhere.



A degree is Paramedic Science is desirable but you could transition from a Nursing Degree by taking a Paramedic Course. Student Paramedics can study for their degree through an apprenticeship route.



A typical working week will be 37.5 hours. Work will be on a shift pattern and will include night shifts, weekends and bank holidays. The work can be physically and emotionally demanding.



Starting Salary is £25,000 with Senior Paramedics or Team Leaders earning between £31,000 - £45,000. Consultant Paramedics and earn up to £74,000.



Numbers of Health Associate Professional Jobs: UK = 99,207 & Gateshead = 299. Expected Growth between 2017-27: UK +15.6% & North East: = +16.9% (available Health Associate Professional jobs are likely to go up both Nationally and in the North East)
