How do we design the Sixth Form Curriculum?

Supported Study

As a team we intervene at the earliest opportunity.

Students can be referred to D Ross by their class teacher for supported study if they are falling behind. D Ross works with class teachers to set targets and supervises students to complete set learning. Each block runs for a half term before being reviewed.
