

Youth Workers support and guide young people aged 11-25 in their development. They work in schools, colleges, faith-based groups of youth centres. Some also work within other settings in the local community like community centres or youth clubs. To be a Youth Worker you must have good communication skills and an ability to build rapport and working relationships with young people, many of whom may be high-risk.
