ZOOKEEPER

Zookeepers work in zoos and usually specialise in working with one animal type or section of the zoo. They are responsible for keeping the animals in their care healthy and to enable them to thrive in captivity. Observing animals, monitoring and recording their activities and assisting with breeding programmes could all be part of the role.
