QUANTITY SURVEYOR

?

A Quantity Surveyor's job is to try to reduce the cost of a construction project. They are responsible for making sure a project adheres to legal quality and safety requirements. Quantity Surveyors need to understand a client's needs, negotiate contracts, prepare and analyse costings, keeping track of the contract and ensuring that the project is delivered safely, on time and within budget - all of which requires excellent organisational skills.



You will need a Degree in Quantity Surveying or in Commercial Management. Other Degrees can still help but it is likely that you will have to do a Postgraduate conversion course (1 year). You could start working as a Technical Surveyor and study alongside to work towards becoming a Quantity Surveyor. Higher and Degree Apprenticeship routes are available.

Working hours are usually around 37- 40 hours per week, although occasional weekend work may be required. You will be mostly office based but will need to be prepared to also work on-site in all weathers.



Salaries for trainees and graduate apprentices are approximately £18,000 - £28,000. Newly qualified Quantity Surveyors usually earn between £25,000 and £35,000 per year. Experienced professional can earn around £55,000 with Senior Management level salaries at £80,000+



Architects, Chartered Architectural Technologists, Planning Officers, Surveyors and construction professionals: UK = 28,770 & Gateshead = 77. Expected Growth between 2017-27: UK +11.8% & North East: = +13.5% (that means that jobs in this sector are likely rise Nationally and in the North East creating up to 5,698 extra jobs in the North East by 2027)
