At Whickham School there are lots of students from other schools. There will be opportunities to make new friends. It can be difficult to get to know someone new.

It may help to act out meeting new people and use some of these suggestions.

- Smile when you say **"Hello"**.
- Start the conversation by asking a question about what they are doing

"What are you doing?" or "What are you reading?"

or about something you have in common

"So how do you like this lesson?"

- Introduce yourself

"By the way my name is _____, what's yours?"

- Ask some other questions to find out about them. Suitable topics may be:

School: **What are you studying?**
Who is your teacher?

Home: **Where do you live?**
How do you get to School?

Interests: **What do you like doing?**
What's your favourite TV programme?

Family: **Have you any brothers and sisters?**

- If they answer your question respond to some of the information they have told you. If you can, ask another question.

- Do not ask about

"That's my favourite lesson too. I enjoyed working on the computers. What did you like doing?"

- Do not ask about sensitive topics. These are topics that could make the other person upset.
- Don't ask about something that makes the person look or sound different.
- Don't ask about any problems he or she may have.
