

Expectations - Code of Dress

Expectations - Code of Dress

- The Sixth Form lanyard must be worn.
- -Students are allowed a single facial piercing and 2 earrings per ear.
- -No elaborate makeup, hair adornments, unnatural hair colours or extreme hairstyles.

Students completing practical courses:

All students are required to come in Code of Dress but can change into specialist clothing for lessons using school changing facilities.





Expectations - Attendance



- There is a clear link between attendance and academic success: Holidays in term time have a significant effect on education
- If absence is planned then please ensure that either:
 - You call the school in advance (ext 204) or A note is brought in by the child
- For unplanned absence (e.g. illness)
 - Please call the school each morning (ext 204)
- Attendance target for each student is 98%
 - A meeting with parents will be held where attendance is a significant concern.
 (90% = 1 day off a fortnight).
 - A formal attendance contract will be drawn up if attendance falls below 80%.

- 1-2-1 Appointments are scheduled starting in Half Term 2
- Initial Appointment will be 30 minutes
- Students can request follow up appointments (as many as they need)
 - Self Awareness interests, skills, strengths and weaknesses
 - Develop an understanding of personal career or study preferences
 - Exploring a range of Post 18 Options available
 - Support personal research to inform decisions
 - Making a careers action plan
 - Raising Aspiration and developing self determination
 - Managing difficulties and setbacks Plan B (or C or D. . . .)
- Group Thematic Sessions (medical / law / degree apprenticeships / Oxbridge)
