

CURRICULUM_____

Having a substantial Sixth Form with increasing numbers, we are able to offer an extensive curriculum to meet the needs of all learners. Over thirty subjects are available, offering progression from Level 2 courses as well as presenting opportunities to study new subject areas. Students are expected to study the equivalent of three of four Level 3 courses.

THE FOLLOWING COURSES ARE AVAILABLE IN SIXTH FORM:

- A-level courses
- BTEC courses
- GCSE resit courses (English Language and Mathematics only)
- Level 3 Diploma (Food and Nutrition)

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Supporting the personal development of our Sixth Form students is a vital aspect of their overall growth and success. We offer a broad range of compulsory and optional opportunities to help students thrive and prepare them for adulthood. Some of these opportunities are outlined below:



ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

Our enrichment programme will vary each year. Examples of current activities are:

- Level 2 and Level 3 Sports Leadership Awards
- Duke of Edinburgh Award
- Work Experience
- Football Academy
- Enrichment Carousel

The enrichment carousel offers a less specialised enrichment offer for those who prefer to experience a broader enrichment pathway. This year the enrichment carousel includes recreational sport, First Aid, Debating, Preparing for overseas travel and RE.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, HEALTH AND ECONOMIC EDUCATION (PSHCE) AND ASSEMBLY PROGRAMME

Compulsory PSHCE sessions are delivered at key points each half term, alongside weekly Sixth Form assemblies. These cover an array of topics which are carefully considered to meet the current needs of our Sixth form learners. Recent topics have included road safety, financial planning, sex and relationships and British Values.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The School has a statutory obligation to deliver Religious Education in the Sixth Form. This is done through offering Religious Education A level and through our enrichment carousel.

Parents have a statutory right to withdraw their child from Religious Education in the Sixth Form. To do so please write to your son/daughter's Head of Year.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCES

At Whickam Sixth Form, we offer a wide range of student leadership opportunities to broaden social skills and foster a sense of accountability. We have a thriving Student Leadership Team with Head Students, Deputies and Ambassadors, who each have a role to support whole school improvement. Wider leadership opportunities include being on the Charity Week committee, running the school equipment shop and having mentoring roles as reading and safeguarding mentors, in addition to taking on roles as ambassadors in mental health and diversity.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Many Universities and Apprenticeship providers expect that students have completed some form of work related experience, indeed it can be an entry requirement to some competitive Universities or courses. Work Experience Week is a key element of the Sixth Form journey, developing future aspiration and personal maturity.

In the summer of Year 12 students have the opportunity to experience work places, job roles and careers that they would not otherwise be able to access with their current level of skill and qualifications. It provides them with the opportunity to develop the transferable skills that are essential for a successful working life.

Students from Whickham have taken part in a wide range of Work Experience placements.



As a result of his performance during Work Experience week, we have offered Robert an internship for the summer holidays so he can expand his knowledge and skills. He has accepted and will work for 4 weeks over the holiday period, working 22.5 hours per week. This is a paid internship to help him gain more experience and cement his thoughts on his future career path.

PASTORAL CARE

Our dedicated Year 12 and Year 13 Pastoral Leaders are here to instil a culture of high expectations in a supportive environment. By focusing on the holistic development of students, they help ensure that each student is equipped academically, emotionally and socially as they approach adulthood. Some of their key roles include:

- Student support
- Parental engagement
- Academic monitoring and support
- Attendance and punctuality monitoring
- Crisis management
- Life skills education

At Whickham School students also have access to a dedicated, onsite counselling team who are available to help navigate students through issues relating to mental health and other personal challenges.



FACILITIES_



The sixth form is housed in a purpose built state of the art building.

THE SILENT STUDY AREA

The silent study area is one of the most used resources in the Sixth Form building. It was specifically requested by students and is well used. It houses a large amount of open plan personal study space, as well as computer provision for study use. The study area is open daily from 7am to 6pm and is well used after school. Study facilities are also open to students during school holidays.

THE SIXTH FORM CAFETERIA

The Cafeteria serves a wide range of hot and cold food and drink. Following consultation with students it was redesigned in 2020 and now also serves Starbucks coffee. The Cafeteria is open from 8.30am to 2.30pm serving students during the school day. There is a self serve Starbucks hot drinks machine which students can access outside of these hours.

CAREERS SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE

The careers support for our Sixth Form students is provided by our on-site qualified Careers Advisor, Mrs Ross. Each student in Year 12 is given a 1:1 careers appointment, where impartial advice is provided to support post-18 destinations and navigate career paths. Mrs Ross is always available to offer follow-up appointments and ongoing support.

CURRICULUM GUIDANCE

Effective Careers Education Information Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) raises aspirations, improves motivation and overcomes barriers to success. Our careers programme empowers students to identify opportunities, build experiences, skills and behaviours essential for a successful working future. During their time in Sixth Form students are supported to develop key employability and enterprise skills which are highly valued by employers, universities, colleges and apprenticeship providers through to provision of a range of Careersbased events, including guest speakers, conferences, exhibitions and external visits.

In Year 12 Students are provided with planned and timetabled 1-to-1 Personal Guidance sessions with Mrs Ross, our dedicated Level 6 qualified Careers Guidance Practitioner. These sessions provide students with access to differentiated, impartial and independent information and guidance about the range of Post 18 education, employment and training options. Students can continue to access support and guidance from Mrs Ross throughout their sixth form journey towards self-awareness, self-determination and self-improvement.

Students are given personalised assistance throughout the UCAS and Apprenticeship application process working with Pastoral Leaders, tutors and Careers Advisor. Our working partnerships with universities, professionals and alumni means our students have additional external, specialist support with applications, personal statements, bespoke guidance sessions, subject specific workshops, and interview preparation.

SIXTH FORM EXPECTATIONS _____

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Attendance and punctuality are vital if success is to be achieved on Sixth Form courses. Punctuality to tutorial time and lessons is fundamental and homework and coursework is required to be completed on time. Failure to produce work can lead to modules being repeated. Our school day starts at 8.35am.

ASSEMBLIES

Sixth Form assemblies are delivered on a weekly basis, covering an array of topics including sex and relationships, personal safety and British values.





CODE OF DRESS

Sixth Form students are required to dress in a manner that would be acceptable within a professional workplace. The Code of Dress below is for the gender which you identify as.
