CURRICULUM

Having a substantial Sixth Form with increasing numbers, we are able to offer an extensive curriculum to meet the needs of all learners. Over thirty subjects are available, offering progression from Level 2 courses as well as presenting opportunities to study new subject areas. Students are expected to study the equivalent of three or four Level 3 courses.

- A-level courses
- BTEC courses
- AAQ courses
- GCSE resit courses (English Language and Mathematics only)
- Level 3 Diploma (Food and Nutrition)

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

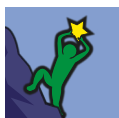
PERSONAL, SOCIAL, HEALTH AND ECONOMIC EDUCATION (PSHCE) AND ASSEMBLY PROGRAMME

Compulsory PSHCE sessions are delivered at key points in the year, alongside weekly Sixth Form assemblies. These cover an array of topics which are carefully considered to meet the current needs of our Sixth Form learners. Recent topics have included road safety, financial planning, sex and relationships and British values.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The School has a statutory obligation to deliver Religious Education in the Sixth Form. This is done through offering Religious Education A level and through our enrichment carousel.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCES

At Whickham Sixth Form, we offer a wide range of student leadership opportunities to broaden social skills and foster a sense of accountability. We have a thriving Student Leadership Team with Head Students, Deputies and Ambassadors, who each have a role to support whole school improvement. Wider leadership opportunities include being on the Charity Week committee, running the school equipment shop and having mentoring roles such as reading and safeguarding mentors, in addition to taking on roles as ambassadors in mental health and diversity.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Many Universities and Apprenticeship providers expect that students have completed some form of

work related experience, indeed it can be an entry requirement to some competitive Universities or courses. Work Experience Week is a key element of the Sixth Form journey, developing future aspiration and personal maturity.

In the summer of Year 12 students have the opportunity to experience work places, job roles and careers that they would not otherwise be able to access with their current level of skill and qualifications. It provides them with the opportunity to develop the transferable skills that are essential for a successful working life.

Students from Whickham have taken part in a wide range of Work Experience placements.

PASTORAL CARE

Our dedicated Year 12 and Year 13 Pastoral Leaders are here to instil a culture of high expectations in a supportive environment. By focusing on the holistic development of students, they help ensure that each student is equipped academically, emotionally and socially as they approach adulthood. Some of their key roles include:

At Whickham School students also have access to a dedicated, onsite counselling team who are available to help navigate students through issues relating to mental health and other personal challenges.



FACILITIES



Our Sixth Form is housed in a purpose built, state of the art building.

STUDY AREAS

Sixth Form students have access to their own study areas, which comprise both open plan personal study space and IT provision. These spaces are some of our most well used resources and we set high expectations around work ethic in these areas. The study areas are open for use throughout the school day, in addition to before and after school hours. Study facilities are regularly open to students during school holidays.

SOCIAL AREAS

The downstairs area of the main Sixth Form block comprises a large, open plan social space for students to dine and meet with friends when they are not in timetabled sessions. Our Sixth Form cafeteria serves a wide range of hot and cold food and drinks. It is open from 8.00am until 2.30pm, serving breakfast, daytime snacks and lunch. We also serve Starbucks' drinks. Outside of these hours, students have access to a vending machine, water cooler and a self-serve Starbucks hot drinks machine.

CAREERS SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE _____

The careers support for our Sixth Form students is provided by our on-site qualified Careers Advisor. Each student in Year 12 is given a 1:1 careers appointment, where impartial advice is provided to support post-18 destinations and navigate career paths.

Our Careers Adviser is always available to offer follow-up appointments and ongoing support.

CURRICULUM GUIDANCE

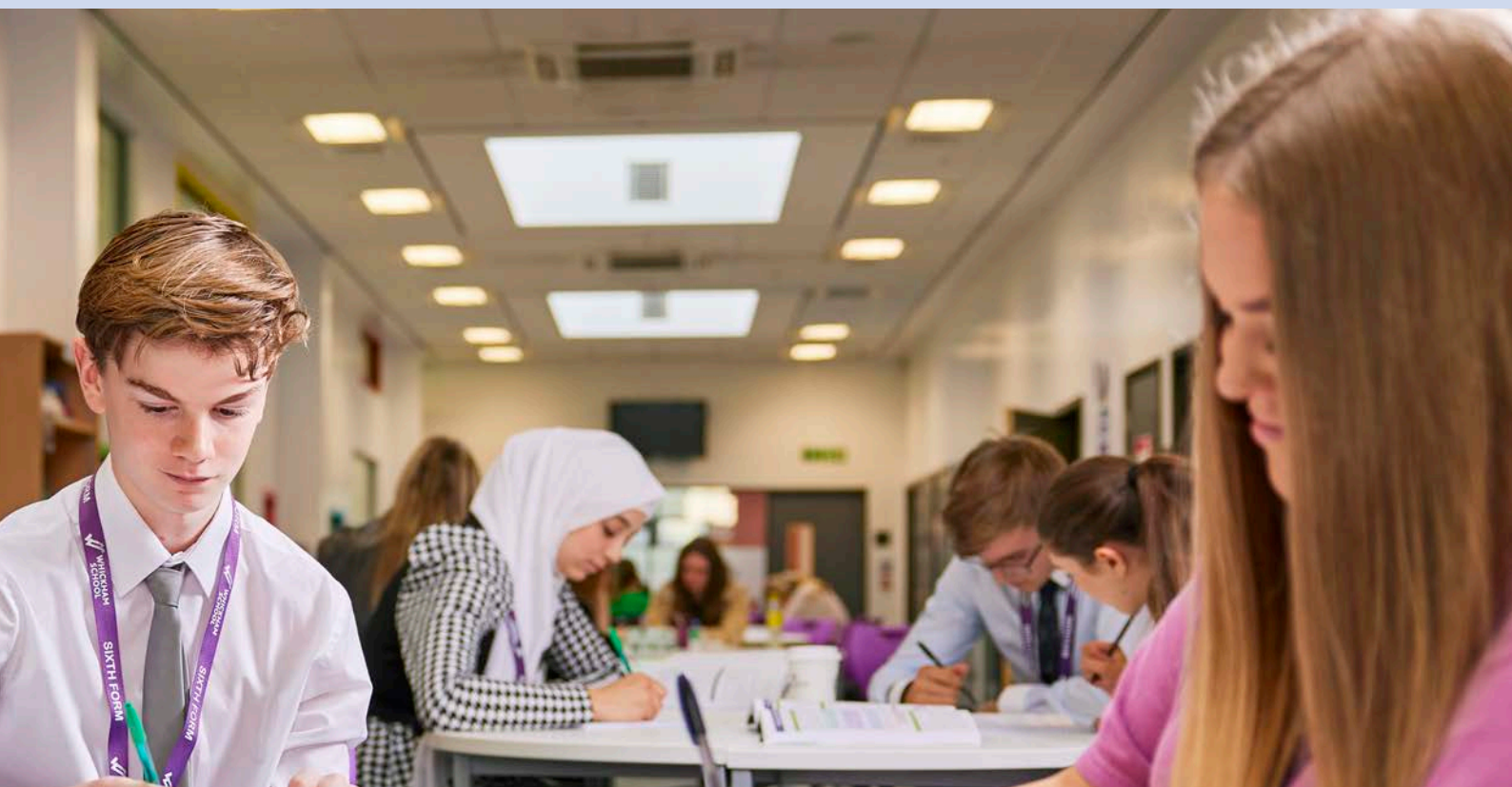
Effective Careers Education Information Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) raises aspirations, improves motivation and overcomes barriers to success. Our careers programme empowers students to identify opportunities, build experiences, skills and behaviours essential for a successful working future. During their time in Sixth Form students are supported to develop key employability and enterprise skills which are highly valued by employers, universities, colleges and apprenticeship providers through to provision of a range of Careers-based events, including guest speakers, conferences, exhibitions and external visits.

In Year 12 Students are provided with planned and timetabled 1-to-1 Personal Guidance sessions with our dedicated Level 6 qualified Careers Guidance Practitioner. These sessions provide students with access to differentiated, impartial and independent

information and guidance about the range of Post 18 education, employment and training options. Students can continue to access support and guidance throughout their Sixth Form journey towards self-awareness, self-determination and self-improvement.

Students are given personalised assistance throughout the UCAS and Apprenticeship application process working with Pastoral Leaders, tutors and Careers Advisor. Our working partnerships with universities, professionals and alumni means our students have additional external, specialist support with applications, personal statements, bespoke guidance sessions, subject specific workshops, and interview preparation.

SIXTH FORM EXPECTATIONS

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Attendance and punctuality are vital if success is to be achieved on Sixth Form courses. Punctuality to tutorial time and lessons is compulsory and homework and coursework is required to be completed on time. Failure to produce work can lead to modules being repeated. Our school day starts at 8.35am.

ASSEMBLIES

Sixth Form assemblies are delivered on a weekly basis, covering an array of topics including sex and relationships, personal safety and British values.





CODE OF DRESS

Sixth Form students are required to dress in a manner that would be acceptable within a professional workplace. The Code of Dress below is for the gender which you identify as.

MALES

- Formal/smart shirt and tie
- Formal/smart trousers
- Formal shoes
- Sixth Form lanyard

Optional:

- Plain jumper over shirt

FEMALES

- Formal/smart top to cover shoulders
- Formal/smart trousers or skirt or dress, of a suitable length
- Formal shoes
- Sixth Form lanyard

Optional:

- Plain jumper/cardigan

Hoodies, crop tops and casual footwear e.g. plimsolls and trainers are not permitted. Tattoos (over 18's) must be discreet and inoffensive.

Students completing practical courses:

All students are required to come in Code of Dress but can change into specialist clothing for lessons using school changing facilities.
