Each section will contain one 8 mark question that will require you to draw upon case study material.	
Paper 2	You will be assessed on: UK Physical Landscapes and UK Human Landscapes. This will examine all content from the Physical Environment section, including Rivers And Coasts and all content from the Human Landscapes, including Newcastle and Rothbury. You will also be examined on your fieldwork, both physical (River Breamish) and urban (Newcastle). There will be three or four 8 mark questions in this paper. The 8 mark questions will require you to analyse a resource for sections A and B. The 8 mark questions for section C will ask about your fieldwork and your evaluation of fieldwork done elsewhere.

Component 1	The mock exam will take place over five hours (one full day). To succeed, students must arrive well-prepared, with a clear intention or aim for their artwork. They should have developed their skills and techniques through studying artists, experimenting with materials, and reviewing and refining their work. Students are expected to have a clear plan for how to use the five-hour session effectively, including incorporating visual research through both drawings and printed images. All materials should be planned and organised in advance to ensure the most effective use of their time. During the exam, the main focus is to improve their work in one or more of the following areas: • AO1: Developing ideas – responding to their chosen theme and research of artists/designers, showing or explaining how these have influenced their work. • AO2: Experimenting with materials – trying out, reviewing, and refining different techniques, media, and processes to find the most effective approach. • AO3: Recording observations – drawing or annotating to document progress and clarify their thought process. • AO4: Presenting a final outcome – producing a finished piece during the timed exam that brings together all their preparation.
