Children's Mental Health Week 2026

Next week in school, we will be marking Children's Mental Health Week. This year's theme *This is My Place* focuses on supporting children to foster a sense of belonging in schools, homes, and communities and builds understanding that, similar to physical health, mental health needs care. The children will be participating in assemblies and activities throughout the week to reflect on their special places and helping them to build on their sense of belonging within our school.

The Zones of Regulation

At Woodford Primary School, we recognise the importance of promoting positive mental health and emotional wellbeing to our pupils and their families. We aim to create an open culture around the discussion of mental health and wellbeing and to empower our children to be able to regulate their emotions.

Since the start of this year, we have been implementing a 'Zones of Regulation' curriculum which aims to teach our pupils to identify emotions in themselves and others and provide them with a bank of strategies to help regulate their emotions and improve their wellbeing.

Please note that **updating the School Grid system alone is not sufficient**. Any changes **must be provided directly to the school office in writing**, so that we can update our official records accordingly. We appreciate your cooperation in helping us maintain accurate records for every pupil.




Scholastic Book Fair
