I am delighted to inform you Woodford Primary School has two winners! These will be announced in our end-of-year assembly tomorrow, where the children will be presented with their certificates.

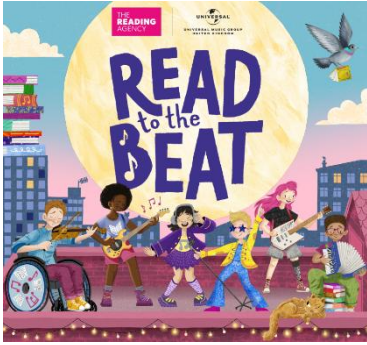
All entries will be on display at the show in the Creative Hobbies marquee if you are going along and would like to take a look.
