Warninglid Primary School uses the Sports Premium funding to:

- Further develop provision and delivery of Outdoor Adventurous Activities (OAA) in school
- Improve well-being
- Broaden the range of sporting opportunities available to pupils
- Promote a healthy lifestyle through participation in sport and outdoor activities
- Train staff in the delivery of OAA
- Promote competition through sport
- Ensure staff have high quality PE and First Aid CPD
- Train year 6 sports crew and playground supervisors to deliver playground games
- Ensure PE leader release time to monitor and further develop PE delivery in the school
